And it is upon this condition, that, that whereas the above bound King Atlas has this day applied to the Clerk of the Eighth District Court, in and for said Parish and State, and obtained from him a license to marry M<sup>rs</sup> Chloe Williams. Now, if within two years from the date hereof, there should not appear to be any legal impediment to said marriage, then the above obligation to be null and void, otherwise to remain in full force.
