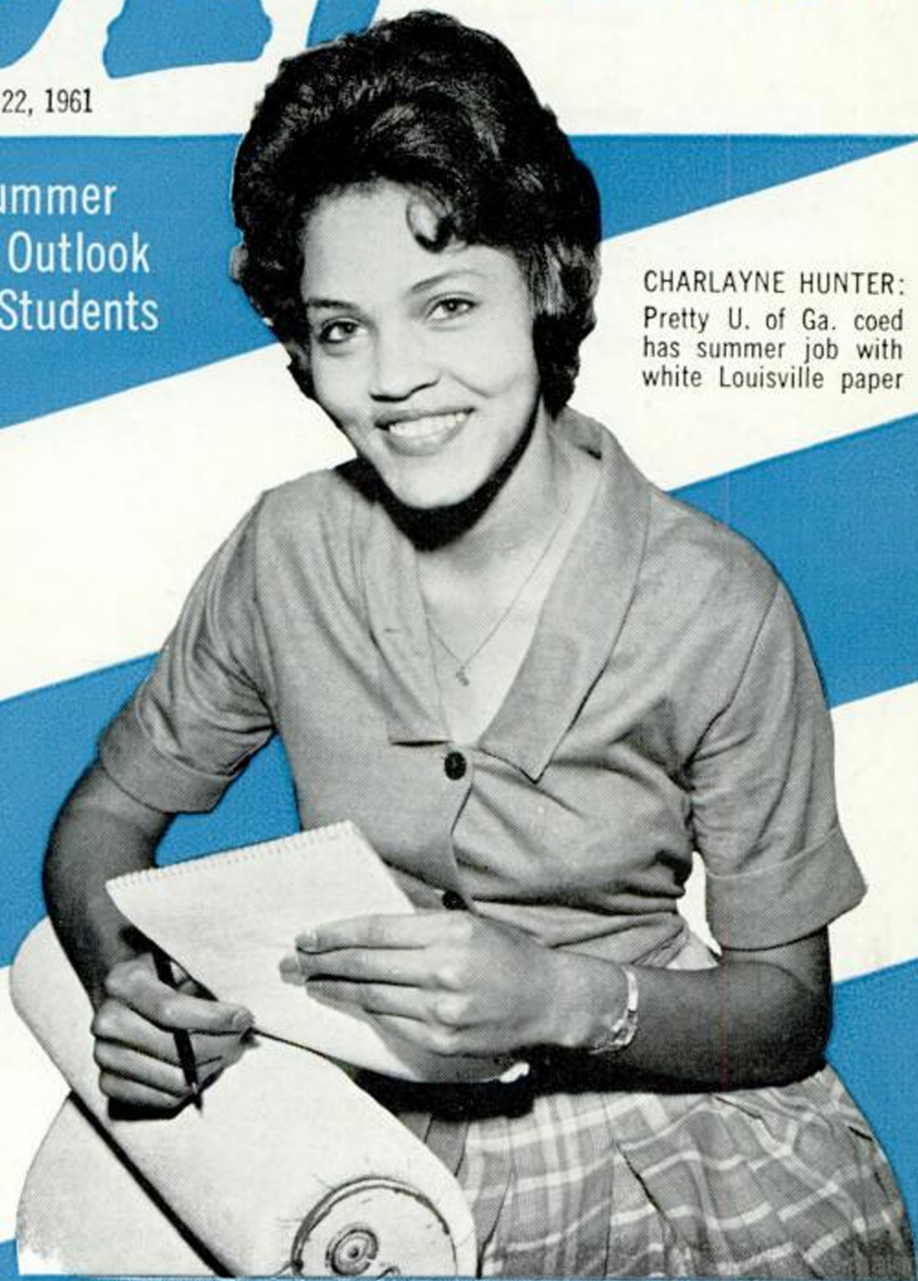

Seven-year-old Anthony Crawford of Atlanta died in an accidental drowning in the swimming pool of Dr. R. P. Jackson. An attempt by Dr. Jackson to apply mouth-to-mouth respiration proved unsuccessful.

Negroes Sue Miss. To Halt Arrest Of Freedom Riders

A sweeping Federal suit challenging segregation against Negroes in Mississippi was filed in support of the Freedom Riders by the NAACP legal Defense Fund lawyers in Jackson. Filed by Atty. Constance Baker Motley amidst false reports of a split among Negro leaders over Freedom Riders, the suit asks an injunction against Mississippi officials who are currently enforcing racial segregation of dining, waiting room and rest room facilities in bus, railroad and airline terminals in Jackson on the basis of unconstitutional local and state ordinances. The suit, filed in behalf of Samuel Bailey, Joseph Broadwater and Burnett L. Jacobs of Jackson, charges that Negro citizens rights "are being continually denied by harassment by officials in the form of arrests, fines and imprisonments."
