

## Gen. Trippi of La. Guard dead at 54

Brig. Gen. Carl L. Trippi, assistant adjutant general for air, Louisiana Air National Guard, died in Hammond Saturday afternoon after becoming ill at a family reunion.

In civilian life, Gen. Trippi, 54, of Metairie, was manager of aircraft operations for Chevron U.S.A., Eastern Region.

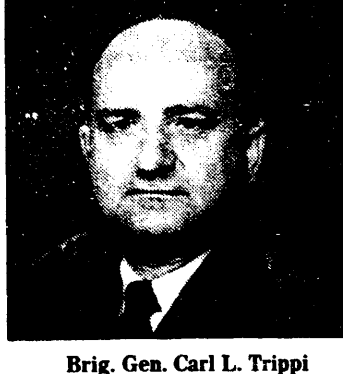
Gen. Trippi was a native of Hammond and attended elementary and high school there.

In 1943, he joined the Army Reserve Corps and was on active duty during World War II. After he left the Army, he joined the Air National Guard in 1946.

In 1951, Gen. Trippi was commissioned and accepted into pilot's training. He graduated from flight school certified for multiengine aircraft.

He served on active duty in the Air Force during the Korean conflict.

In 1964, Gen. Trippi was named commander of Consolidated Aircraft

Maintenance Squadron of the 159th Tactical Fighter group of the Air National Guard. In 1973 he was named deputy chief of staff for the Air National Guard, and then chief of staff.

In 1979, he was named assistant adjutant general for air.

Gen. Trippi is survived by his wife, the former Rita Stumph; a daughter, Susan; and a stepson, Lyle B. Helwick of Metairie.

Interment will be in Providence Memorial Park. Glapion's Funeral Home, 2201 Caffin Ave., is in charge of arrangements.

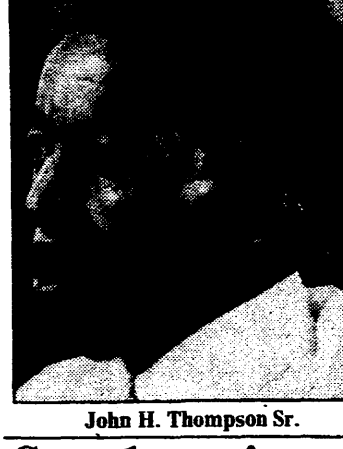
Mr. Thompson died Thursday after a lengthy illness. He was 68.
