Gen. Trippi of La. Guard dead at 54

Brig. Gen. Carl L. Trippi, assistant adjutant general for air, Louisiana Air National Guard, died in Hammond Saturday afternoon after becoming ill at a family reunion.

In civilian life, Gen. Trippi, 54, of Metairie, was manager of aircraft operations for Chevron U.S.A, Eastern

Gen. Trippi was a native of Hammond and attended elementary and high school there.

In 1943, he joined the Army Reserve Corps and was on active duty during World War II. After he left the Army, he joined the Air National Guard in 1946
