European Hopeful U.S. Soybean Ban To End by Fall

WASHINGTON (\*) — A European Common Market official yesterday said he got the "strong-impression" in talks with American officials that the United States would lift its ban on soybean and other agricultural exports at the end of September.

While the assurances were "not 100 per cent" said Petrus J. Lardinois, an agricultural affairs specialist for the nine-member European Economic Community, "my impression is that there is a will in this government to restore normal trade patterns."

Reestablishment of free trade and an open market is "the most important thing," he said, in the view of the United States' European customers.

"It is in all our interests to restore normal trade," he said.

Lardinois spoke at a news conference after a one-day series of conferences with high - ranking — American officials, including Agricultural Secretary Earl Butz, Herbert Stein, chairman of the President's Council of Economic Advisers, and William J. Casey, undersecretary of state for economic affair
