## Obituary

Of the late L. B. ATLAS, who died July 13, 8:00 A. M.  
at the Hospital in New Orleans, La.

Bro. L. B. Atlas was the youngest son of the late Mr. King Atlas and the late Sister Alice Moore Atlas.

He was born October 29, 1874 on the then known as Longwood Plantation. He attended the best school East Carroll Parish offered to Negroes in the early part of his life.

He was called and baptised at the Mt. Lebanon M. B. Church by the late Rev. Jack Williams. He remained in that church for a number of years as a Deacon. During the year 1921 he was one among the few Christians who banded themselves together and organized the Progressive M. B. Church, under the pastorage of the late Dr. S. G. Gaither.

He served as Secretary of the church and Sunday School Teacher of the Adult Class for many years and he served as a Deacon until the end.

In the year 1894 he was married to the late Miss Susie Lee. To this union was born 6 sons and 5 daughters.
