Reflections of Marvin's Life

Marvin Junior Newton was born to Victoria Newton on October 24, 1947 in New Albany, Mississippi. And on Friday, November 14, 2014 he departed this life at Wheaton Franciscan Hospital in Franklin, Wisconsin.

Known as "The Fig", Marvin received his high school diploma from Roosevelt High School in 1965 in Gary, Indiana. Following graduation, he enlisted in the United States Air Force, and while he was stationed in Germany he earned the rank of Senior Airman. Marvin was honorably discharged, after four years of service, and returned to Gary, Indiana, where he earned a Welding Certification and began a career with the U.S. Steel Mill.

On November 22, 1969 Marvin was united in holy matrimony to Castoria Kindred. The two were blessed with a daughter, Kelly Janine Newton. Upon the conclusion of this union, he briefly relocated to Texas in hopes of new beginnings. Always the family man, his stay in Texas was short-lived, as he desired to be closer to family. Marvin returned to the Midwest and established roots in Milwaukee, Wisconsin in 1980.

In 1980, Marvin accepted Christ as his personal savior and joined Mount Moriah Baptist Church where he sang in the choir.

Shortly thereafter, Marvin again found love and united in holy matrimony with Gloriastine Lucas on April 18, 1981. They were blessed with two children, Rosalyn Nicole and Marvin Jay Newton, Jr.

Marvin continued his chosen career in welding and machine operating for the next twenty years and was highly respected by his peers. Marvin spent his time enjoying the company of friends and family, watching sports, and lending a hand to those in need. He also took time to mentor and share his wisdom with the young men he encountered. Marvin will be remembered most for his bright smile, humor, and charisma.
