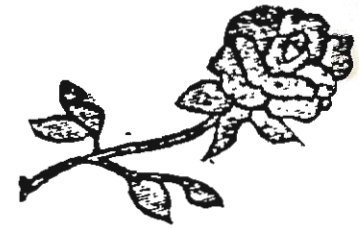

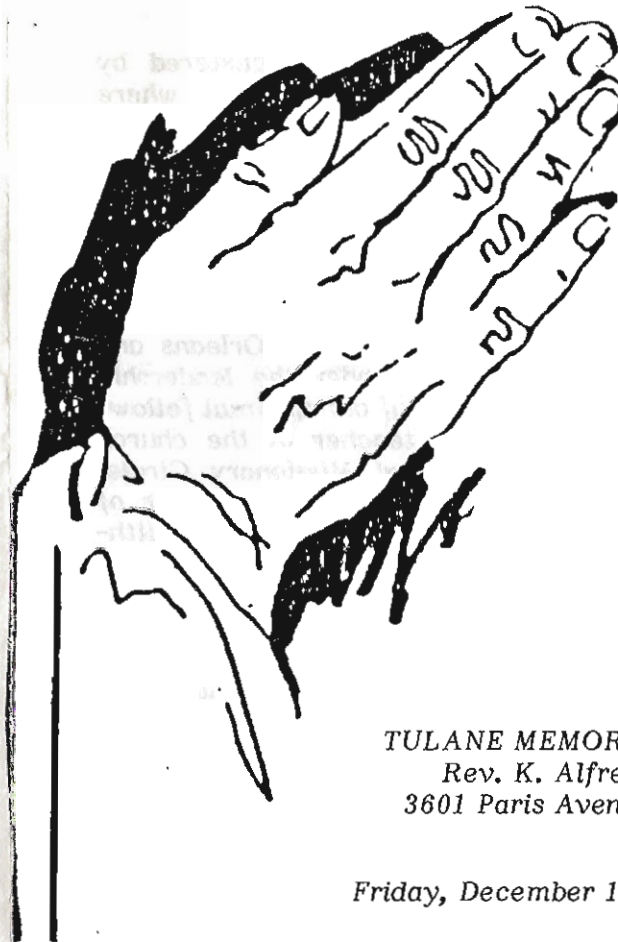

Sister Cora Atlas Thompson was born on December 1, 1912 in Lake Providence, LA to the union of Louis B. and Susie Lee Atlas. She was converted at an early age and was baptized at the Progressive Baptist Church by the Rev. A. S. Cooper.

She was educated in the school system administered by the Baptist Association of Lake Providence, LA where she received her high school diploma.

She was joined in holy matrimony to the late John H. Thompson, Sr. on December 15, 1929. To this union were born Louis, the late John, Jr., Grace, the late Pierce, Alice, Jean, and Shirley.

In 1943, she and her husband moved to New Orleans and joined Tulane Avenue Baptist Church under the leadership of the Rev. N. T. Burke. While a part of our spiritual fellowship, Sister Thompson served as a teacher in the church school, a member of the Ninth Ward Missionary Circle, President of the Individual Touch Club, and a member of the Deaconess Board. Over the years, she has served faithfully and well.

She was Chairwoman of the Nurses Guild of the Ideal Missionary Baptist and Educational Women's Auxiliary. She was also a member of the President's Council of this auxiliary. She was a former president of the Lower Ninth Ward Neighborhood Improvement Association, a board member of Total Community Action; and a board member of the Southern Organization for Unified Leadership (SOUL).

After a brief illness, Sister Thompson expired on Tuesday, December 10, 1985, at 3:30 p.m. at United Medical Center. She leaves to mourn her passing one son: Louis; four daughters: Grace Parker, Alice Thompson, Jean Eng, and Shirley Thompson; 11 grandchildren, 4 great grandchildren, five brothers: King, Louie, Joseph, Lawrence, and Wesley Atlas; two sisters: Ethel and Annie Atlas; one son-in-law: Joseph Parker, Sr., a host of nieces, nephews, other relatives, friends, and neighbors.
