

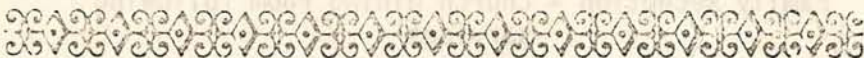


HEAVEN'S VERY SPECIAL CHILD
